

Cloud Shape Dimensions with #8 US Knitting Needle & Worsted Weight Yarn:

Small Cloud 6" wide by 4.5" tall, approximately Large Cloud 9.5" wide by 5.5" tall, approximately

Materials

Yarn, in any weight / color of your choice Straight Knitting Needles, sized for your yarn Tapestry Needle; Scissors

Abbreviations

<u>BO</u>: Bind Off <u>CO</u>: Cast On, Long-Tail <u>K</u>: Knit <u>CCO</u>: Cast On, Cable Method (increases)

K1M1: Knit One, Make One (increases)

<u>K2Tog</u>: Knit 2 Together (decreases)

SLKPSSO: Slip Knit Pass One Stitch Over (decreases)

Using #8 US Knitting Needle & Worsted Weight Yarn: 9.5" wide by 5.5" tall, approximately

Stitches Remain

Knitting from the bottom up, we begin by making the lower left cloud curve.

Using #8 US Knitting Needle & Worsted Weight Yarn: 6" wide by 4.5" tall, approximately

Knitting from the bottom up, we begin by making the lower left cloud curve.

Row	Instruction	Stitches Remain
1 2 3 4 5	CO 1 Stitches K1M1, CCO 1 K 3, CCO 3 K 6, CCO 1 K 6, K1M1 K 8 Break Yarn	3 stitches remain 6 7 8 8

Keeping the above cloud curve on its needle, Cast On to your empty needle to begin making the lower right cloud curve.
